

Information Regarding the Vaccination of Travellers to the U.S.A. or Canada

The position is governed by Article 83 of the International Sanitary Regulations which make it clear that objectors to vaccination can refuse the operation without being refused admission into those countries which have accepted the International Sanitary Regulations.

Article 83 of the International Sanitary Regulations runs as follows :—

1. A health administration may require a person on an international voyage who does not show sufficient evidence of protection by vaccination or by a previous attack of smallpox to possess, on arrival, a certificate of vaccination against smallpox. Any such person who cannot produce such a certificate may be vaccinated ; if he refuses to be vaccinated he may be placed under surveillance for not more than fourteen days, reckoned from the date of his departure from the last territory visited before arrival.

2. A person on an international voyage, who during a period of fourteen days before his arrival has visited an infected local area and who, in the opinion of the health authority is not sufficiently protected by vaccination or by a previous attack of smallpox, may be required to be vaccinated or may be placed under surveillance, or may be vaccinated and then placed under surveillance ; if he refuses to be vaccinated he may be isolated. The period of surveillance or isolation shall not be more than fourteen days, reckoned from the date of his departure from the infected local area. A valid certificate of vaccination against smallpox shall be considered as evidence of sufficient protection.

SURVEILLANCE. Surveillance is specially defined in Article 27 of the Regulations as follows :—

1. A person under surveillance shall not be isolated but shall be permitted to move about freely. The health authority may require him to report to it, if necessary, at specified intervals during the period of surveillance. Except as limited by the provision of Article 69, the health authority may also subject such a person to medical investigation, and make any inquiries which are necessary for ascertaining his state of health.

2. When a person under surveillance departs for another place, within or without the same territory, he shall inform the health authority which shall immediately notify the health authority of the place to which the person is proceeding. On arrival the person shall report to that health authority which may apply the measure provided for in paragraph 1 of this article.

OTHER INFORMATION FOR PASSENGERS FLYING OVER PARTS OF AFRICA.

For passengers flying over parts of Africa a certificate of inoculation against yellow fever is required by a number of Governments. Some other countries require anti-typhoid inoculation as a condition of admission. This is not in accordance with the International Sanitary Regulations.

Some of the steamship companies tell inquirers that vaccination certificates must be produced for certain countries which do not actually require them. A firm attitude towards them is necessary and is usually successful.

No disease has ever been controlled by vaccination or inoculation.

Millions of people have travelled all over the world without vaccination or inoculation certificates during the past 50 years, and there is no record that any of them ever took any disease into any country. The idea that disease can be controlled by the possession of a vaccination or inoculation certificate is sheer fantasy.

It is believed that an American vaccine and serum trust is the instigator of these recent attempts at universal poisoning of the blood of travellers. Mastery of the facts, constant pointing out of the truth, and firm resistance of all these assaults on the body (and also on the mind) will succeed in getting rid of these injurious and tyrannical interferences with human freedom and human rights.
